

For more than a quarter of a century, the St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center has been dedicated to offering the very best cancer care and is proud to provide the very best in today's cancer treatment while being close to the home of residents in St. Clair, Sanilac and northern Macomb counties.

For more than 25 years, the highly-skilled, compassionate professionals of the St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center have been dedicated to providing the most advanced state of the art cancer treatments available. The St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center has been recognized year after year for providing high-quality, comprehensive, multidisciplinary patient-centered care to oncology patients by the Commission on Cancer (CoC) of the American College of Surgeons.

The St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center is the only comprehensive cancer treatment center in the area to offer access to the Michigan Cancer Research Consortium (MCRC), which is part of the Community Clinical Oncology Program (CCOP), providing for access to advanced clinical cancer research trials. It is the only center in the area to offer radiation therapy for the treatment of cancer. It provides access to a multidisciplinary team that works in concert to offer the best cancer treatment options available through individual tumor board review. It is the only center in the region to host an *Annual Cancer Care Symposium* to which health care professionals turn to obtain continuing education credits.

Q & A

A Legacy Interview With Radiation Oncologist Kanu Dalal, MD

Kanu Dalal, MD, has been a part of St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron for more than 28 years. As a radiation oncologist, his focus is not just on treating the cancer, but the patient and their family as they navigate their harrowing health journey. Demonstrating a quiet confidence throughout the hospital's radiation therapy department, Dr. Dalal has become a fixture in the Blue Water Area in providing advanced radiation therapy to cancer patients, eliminating the need to travel far from home to receive high quality, advanced cancer care.

Marleigh Jones, Cancer Registrar, recently sat down with Dr. Dalal to discuss his career and his personal philosophy on cancer treatment, along with the radiation therapy program available at St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron.

Jones: Why did you choose medicine as your career?

Dalal: I watched my family struggle with a variety of medical problems as a youngster. I saw medicine as a way I could help my family and all people. Studying medicine would not only allow me to understand my family's medical problems, but focus on prevention and become a teacher and advocate for their health.

Jones: After starting your medical education, what made you decide to go into radiation oncology?

Dalal: I initially wanted to be a surgeon. But I was fortunate to have a fellow physician and friend introduce me to radiation oncology. I saw a significant amount of promise and advancement in this field. I knew there would be a lot of change and opportunity for growth; it seemed as though new technology and medical advances would be abundant in this field in the years to come.

Jones: If you could pick just one moment, what would you say has been the most exciting moment of your career so far?

Dalal: I see a lot of cancer patients that would have gone through very invasive surgery, but by using radiation therapy they have come through their cancer diagnosis with the same prognosis. To be able to help patients find different avenues to treat their cancer, without going through unnecessary or invasive surgery has been rewarding and is one of the reasons I am so invested in this area of medicine.

Jones: What is your favorite part of your job?

Dalal: Without hesitation, it is educating the patient and their family. I have the opportunity, on a daily basis, to help them understand their problem and diagnosis. I explain their cancer so they are able to understand. I believe this is one of the most important parts of my job. After my patients are educated in their diagnosis and treatment options, and fully understand it, they are able to meaningfully decide on their course of treatment. To me it is very important that the patient and their support group understand every phase of their diagnosis and treatment so they are able to make the best decisions for themselves.

Jones: You have been working at St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron for 28 years, what has kept you here, what makes this hospital special?

Dalal: I like the patient-centered care here; the residents of this area are able to receive advanced cancer treatment here, without having to leave the area. They will be treated with the same advanced technology; access to clinical trials; have access to top-notch oncologists and medical doctors; and our patients are our number one priority. Caring for the mind, body and spirit have always been priorities here, regardless of diagnosis or financial ability. We are determined to provide appropriate and necessary treatments for every patient we see.

Jones: What is your vision for the St. Joseph Mercy Cancer Center in the coming years?

Dalal: I would like to see the continuation of providing state of the art treatment for cancer. Our team is dedicated to continuous improvement and focusing on progress. I know our community will continue to see the newest forms of cancer treatment management offered in the country. We will always work our hardest to provide the Blue Water Area the most advanced cancer treatments close to home.

Jones: With many new physicians entering the medical field each year, what would be your advice to younger oncologists as they begin their careers?

Dalal: It is my sincere belief that we must treat the patient and family, not just the cancer that the patient has been diagnosed with. That is what I would like to share with and pass to younger doctors entering this field. It is incredibly important to the patient, to you, and to the treatment program that we see the patient as a whole, not just their cancer diagnosis. I see too many physicians treat just the disease and neglect to see the suffering in the patient and family because of the disease.

Jones: Are you satisfied with your career thus far?

Dalal: I am very fulfilled. I have had an amazing journey in this area and in my medical career. I realize how blessed I am to have helped a great number of people in need. To look back at all of those patients and know I had a hand in providing their care is a remarkable feeling of fulfillment.

Jones: What would you like your legacy to be?

Dalal: I hope I have influenced the oncology program at St. Joseph Mercy and those working here to continue to provide state of the art treatments for future generations. I would like my legacy to be that all who enter through our cancer center doors tomorrow and much further down the road to feel cared for, safe and secure as they go through the uncertainty and fearful time that a cancer diagnosis can bring; knowing they are receiving the best possible medical treatments, by a team of professionals who truly care about them as well as treating their cancer diagnosis.

Clinical Trials Accruals

Leading the Way in Clinical Research

The St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center is a member of the National Cancer Institute (NCI) Community Oncology Research Program (NCORP); a national network of organizations that provide cancer care to diverse populations in community-based healthcare practices.

The St. Joseph Mercy Health System (SJMHS) Michigan Research Consortium (MCR) has been awarded a grant for \$10M in funding over the next 5 years. The St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center is a member of the Michigan Cancer Research Consortium and accredited by the Commission on Cancer (CoC). Our grant application received the highest grant impact score. This grant funding will be used to support infrastructures and personnel who will assist patients in participating in more than 120 clinical trials available. We provide patients access to studies and new treatments that are otherwise not available. Their participation helps our doctors and research staff to learn more about cancer.

In 2013, 555 patients were screened and 35 (6.3%) of our patients participated in trials; 4.3% above the standard requirement of 2%.

Mercy Women's Health Center Launches New Comprehensive Breast Services

The Mercy Women's Health Center launched a Comprehensive Breast Center (CBC) to identify women at an increased risk of developing breast cancer. The new enhancements to the St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Women's Center include the provision of: MammoPlus, RiskPlus, and Rapid Results. Through the CBC, medical professionals are able to provide far more than a traditional mammography using the latest compressive breast health technology and services from screening and diagnostic, to a variety of treatment options and survivorship support. Through the MammoPlus service, women are provided digital screening mammography PLUS a lifetime risk assessment for breast cancer. As part of the program, each patient is offered the National Cancer Institute's Breast Cancer Risk Assessment as a part of their standard mammography service. Through RiskPlus, patients who are classified as being high risk complete a Risk Analysis covering more than 70 data points, allowing for deep examination of genetic, familial and personal breast risk, based on national intervention guidelines. Rounding out the services now offered through the Comprehensive Breast Center is RapidResults. Through RapidResults, patients are offered same-day access to all appropriate diagnostics services. The ultimate goal of this program is to reduce overall mortality and morbidity from breast cancer. This new prevention and monitoring program allows us to work closer with women who are at a higher risk for developing breast cancer and to provide intervention recommendations, respond faster and provide more in-depth care in an effort to detect breast cancer in its earliest stages; which is critical to a successful treatment and achieving our goal.

St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Launches New Outpatient Infusion Center

St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron launched a new outpatient infusion center to provide a comfortable, convenient setting for outpatient chemotherapy and infusion services. Laboratory testing and other services are performed by the St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron's state-of-the-art laboratory while patients rest in comfortable recliners. We are committed to providing personalized and compassionate care in a comfortable and convenient environment.

The Nora Condland Story

Nora Condland has battled breast cancer and survived twice. She credits the care she received at the St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center, for the positive outcome. "Both times I was diagnosed I was treated by a team", remembers Nora, "I was embraced by physicians, nurses and various other specialists who took the time to discuss my diagnosis, my treatment options and who walked through both journeys with me."

Nora was so motivated by her care and treatment at St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron she has dedicated her time and talents to the hospital. She has been a driving force behind the remodeling of St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center's infusion rooms, as well as creating a more welcoming, healing atmosphere in the hospital and patient care rooms.

As Nora reflects on her care, she remembers the very human interaction she had with her TEAM and the ease of access to high quality physicians and specialists in the Blue Water Area. "I find it frustrating to hear

people talk about the level of care they can receive by traveling out of town. I firmly believe that is subjective." Nora comments after remembering the many Fridays she spent with Dr. Demashkieh, "Every Friday, following my surgery, Dr. Demashkieh would come in to his office on his day off (golf clubs in hand) to perform a minor procedure just to keep me more comfortable over the weekend. Each time I came in I was greeted with a smile and cared for with true compassion."

"The physician capabilities and the therapies available through the St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center are absolutely comparable to those available in a larger community; the difference is those treating me remember me and my cancer journey without reviewing my chart each time I had an appointment with them." Nora is St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center's biggest cheerleader and as a former patient, its strongest advocate. "Simply based on my care and outcomes, I am comfortable recommending the cancer team at St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron," states Nora.

"But after I heard Dr. Dalal tell a close friend, 'You see your diagnosis as a glass half empty situation; we see the glass as half full. Together we will beat this.' I knew physicians who were that positive and motivating to their patients were clearly in a league of their own."

St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron Cancer Center is proud to offer a multi-faceted team of specialists all working in concert to provide the best outcomes for their patients. It is about delivering remarkable medicine in a compassionate environment to care for the whole patient, not just the cancer diagnosis. "The team at St. Joseph Mercy is purposeful in its intent to care for patients above and beyond what is simply medically necessary," Nora concludes. "The compassion, drive and desire to heal patients from the initial contact through all follow-up care is what every person facing a cancer diagnosis should receive...not just to have hope, but to survive."

After receiving such personal care, Nora was moved to give back to the hospital and team that cared for her. In late 2013, Nora initiated the first of many art projects to come beginning with the "Helping Hands" mosaic artwork. A mosaic mural dedicated to "the many people who have gone out of their way on my behalf during my illnesses. I was simply inspired to give something back" commented Nora.

The second project was to further upgrade the outpatient infusion rooms. Having received several rounds of

chemotherapy herself, Nora knew the importance and further impact positive holistic surroundings could have on a patient's treatment and overall experience.

The next project has been coined *Prescription: Art* and has evolved into a team effort funded by donations. We solicited local artists to create art pieces for the hospital. To date, over 100 pieces have been donated by local artists, gracing the walls of St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron covering the majority of the first floor and the newly renovated third floor patient rooms.

The most recent venture was the design and completion of over 30 mosaics, completed by hospital colleagues under the guidance of Nora. The mosaics reflect the unity of the various hospital departments and their importance in the delivery of care. "The works of art donated by staff make a breathtaking wall in our main corridor," comments Nora.

"It is an honor to display this artwork from so many talented people in our community," commented Rebekah Smith, RN, President and CEO of St. Joseph Mercy Port Huron. "This allows us to provide an additional dimension of healing, and allows us to create a more welcoming and peaceful environment. Elevating the environment in which we deliver care allows us to provide multi-dimensional care, providing healing not just to the body, but to the mind, spirit and soul", continued Becky.
